WELCOME

GREETING

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Church, world, souls, memories, longings, and desires yearn for the ancient vision of the prophets to be fulfilled.

Right side: The eyes blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongues of the speechless sing for joy.

Left side: For waters shall break forth in the wilderness, and streams in the desert, the burning sand shall become a pool, and the thirsty ground springs of water. (Isaiah 35: 5-7)

By the Spirit, a vision wells up in the people of God who yearn for healing and restoration; for justice, not terrorism; for forgiveness, not hate.
